#### Memorandum for the Record

The following actions were taken by the BOD since the last General Business meeting held on August 3, 2019. Individual motions were made, seconded, and passed by the Elected Officers and members of the Board of Directors on the date indicated. Any conflicts with the Bylaws will be addressed at a future date.

- a. Approved the 2019 Board of Directors Minutes on December 2, 2019.
- b. Approved the cancellation of Convention 2020 on May 5, 2020.
- c. Approved the 2020/2021 Budget on May 18, 2020.
- d. Affirmed that the COVID 19 National Crisis did, in fact, constitute, in the opinion of a majority of the Elected Officers and Board of Directors, an "Event not covered the Bylaws" and further affirmed the Board of Director's ability to exercise its authority, as identified in Section I of Article III of the Bylaws, to govern the association as deemed appropriate by a quorum of the Board of Directors or as dictated by Robert's Rules of Order on May 29, 2020.
  - e. Approved the extension all National Officer's terms of offices by one year on May 30, 2020.
  - f. Approved the Appointment of Amber Roth as Red Shirt Editor on June 26, 2020.

This memorandum shall serve as a permanent record and shall be included in Appendix A.




### AO1(AW/SW) Nicholas Beemer

### USS Theodore Roosevelt (CVN71)

Nicholas Alexander Beemer enlisted in the United States Navy on August 29 2007. Upon completion of recruit training at RTC Great Lakes, he reported to Naval Special Warfare Center, Coronado, CA. He spent several months in training; however, due to a change in commitment, he pursued a different career path and selected the Aviation Ordnanceman rating.

He reported to NATTC Pensacola, Florida to attend AO A-school. Upon graduation, he received orders to USS NIMITZ (CVN 68), where he was assigned to 74 series magazine, G-3 Division during a Planned Incremental Availability (PIA). After a successful PIA and training cycle, he deployed to the Arabian Gulf where he was advanced to Petty Officer Third Class.

Tasked with his new leadership role as 138 series Magazine Supervisor, he successfully led seven Sailors in the upload and download of over 300,000 rounds of 20MM ammunition in support of operation ENDURING FREEDOM.









After a successful deployment and return to homeport San Diego for another PIA, he was advanced to Petty Officer Second Class. He was hand-selected by the Ordnance Handling Officer (OHO) and re-assigned to G-5 division as an ammo accountant. During his second combat deployment onboard NIMITZ, he served as the Ammo Accounting Night Check Supervisor where he tracked and accounted for over 2,700 ordnance line items valued at \$320 million. For his outstanding performance he was awarded the Navy and Marine Corps Achievement medal.

He was detailed to MCAS Iwakuni, Japan. Upon arrival, he was assigned as Magazine Crew LPO, leading 14 Marines and Sailors in the receipt, issue and fleet sentencing of numerous ordnance assets. Eagerly accepting more responsibility, he was nominated as the "Logisticians Association President". He planned and coordinated several fundraising events earning the association more than \$5,000. His flawless management of assigned duties earned him recognition as Junior Sailor of the Quarter, 2nd Quarter, FY 2016.



In 2016, Petty Officer Beemer reported to Navy Munitions Command Pacific Conus West Division Detachment Lemoore. Shortly after arriving, he was promoted to Petty Officer First Class and assigned as ammo accounting LPO where he managed 2,800 ordnance line items within the detachment as well as 16 squadrons and three tenant commands. He was later re-assigned as Magazine LPO where he led 12 Sailors in preparation for a successful Explosive Safety Inspection (ESI) and flawlessly tracked \$330 million of conventional ordnance. Additionally, his achievements led to his selection as Senior Sailor of the Quarter, 3rd Quarter FY 2016.

Petty Officer Beemer is currently serving onboard USS THEODORE ROOSEVELT (CVN 71) as the G-5 Divisional Leading Petty Officer. His decorations and awards include the Navy and Marine Corps Achievement Medal (four), and various other unit, campaign and personal awards.

#### 2020 JOHN W. FINN AVIATION ORDNANCEMAN OF THE YEAR RUNNER-UP

AO1(AW/SW) Marcus E. Spencer

USS Dwight D. Eisenhower (CVN69)

Marcus E. Spencer enlisted in the United States Navy in 2008.

After graduating from Recruit Training Command Great Lakes, IL in November 2008 and from Naval Air Technical Training Center (NATTC) Aviation Ordnanceman (AO). A" School in January 2009; and reported to the newly commissioned USS GEORGE H. W. BUSH (CVN 77). As a member of the 74-magazine series, he loaded and downloaded the Linkless Ammunitions Loading System III, conducted wall-to-wall inventories, and completed two Weapons onloads and one offload and after six months he was promoted to Third Class Petty Officer. In 2011 he was advanced to Second Class Petty Officer and moved to 84 magazine series as the Leading Petty Officer (LPO). There he led over 50 bomb builds in support of Operation Enduring Freedom, earning his position as a Quality Assurance/ Safety Observer.

In 2013 he arrived at his second duty station, NATTC Pensacola, where he served as an AO "A" School Instructor. There he was involved in simultaneously developing new accession Sailors and his peers. He instructed 931 Sailors and Marines through 1,100 course curriculum hours and maintained an attrition rate of less than one percent. In his last year at NATTC, he advanced to Petty Officer First Class and was designated as a Master Training Specialist Program Mentor. Additionally, he served as the Association of Aviation Ordnanceman Chapter 34 Secretary.

Petty Officer Spencer reported to his current command, USS DWIGHT D. EISENHOWER (CVN 69) in January of 2017, initially serving in G-3 Division as a Forward Magazine Supervisor before being selected by the Ordnance Handling Officer to lead G-5 as the LPO. The following year AO1 became the G-1 LPO, leading eight First Class Petty Officers and 70 junior Sailors in the upkeep and maintenance of six magazines, 17 ordnance lockers, and 2,540 Armament Weapons Support Equipment assets. His final accomplishment before heading to Aircraft Intermediate Maintenance Department (AIMD) was the safe and efficient onload of 2.4 million pounds of ordnance.

Today AO I displays his versatility while serving as a Quality Assurance Representative in AIMD Quality Assurance where he has also earned his Collateral Duty Inspector in the 731 and 710 workcenters. His collaterals duties on board IKE include: AAO Chapter 69 President, Command Mentorship Coordinator, Assistant Command Financial Specialist, Departmental Sponsorship Coordinator, Departmental Security Manager, Quality Assurance/Safety Officer, Qual/Cert Board Member, Weapons Training Team, and Gunnery Liaison Officer.



AO1 Spencer has been awarded three Navy and Marine Corp Achievement Medals, three Good Conduct Awards, and the Military Outstanding Volunteer Service Medal. He has also earned various unit citations and a Grey Belt in Marine Corps Martial Arts.

irst off I want to thank the Association of Aviation Ordnancemen membership for your support over the last 17 or so years. This has been a very rewarding time for me as your Editor of The Red Shirt. I've enjoyed all the calls and letters you've made and sent and really loved hearing all of the stories from days of old and I hope I've been able to portray them properly back to you in these issues. Secondly I'd like to thank AOC (ret) Amber Roth for stepping up and accepting this duty, I know you'll do great at this and I'm always around if you need help with something on this venture! To all the past and current officers and board members of the AAO, thank-you for your support as well!

I joined the Navy and left for Bootcamp at Great Lakes, IL, in December 1981. I was a non-rate because I really didn't know what I wanted to do except get out of Ravenna, OH and see the world! Graduating Bootcamp in February 1982 I started 4 weeks of Aviation Apprentice School and after leave reported to the VA-174 HELLRAZORS at NAS Cecil Field, FL. After completing FRAMP I reported to the VA-81 SUNLINERS, "WHO SAID SUNLINER!!" I was assigned to the Line Shack and became a Plane Captain on the A-7 aircraft. As we were getting ready to board the C-9 to fly home from Fallon, NV AOC Will Pitts grabbed me and sat me next to him for the whole looooong flight back to Cecil Filed. I was thinking holy crap, I have to sit next to the Chief all the way home!! After a few deployments with VA-81 I checked into Weapons Department at NAS Cecil Field in 1986 for a great 3 year shore duty tour! My job was converted to a Government position thanks to the help of Mr. John Palliotta and Mr. Joe Odom both of who are not with us today......2 more individuals who helped shape my career and they were both USAF retired. I worked my way up from and LMS to DAPML to the APML of AMRAAM. For the last 8 years I have been the APML for the Advanced Programs Division and continue on there today bringing new weapons and hopefully new ways of thinking to the Joint Weapons World!

After I retired from the navy Steve Cashat was looking for someone to take over the RedShirt and I gladly accepted this duty from him in 2003. 



#### AAO PRESIDENTIAL HAT HISTORY

I reached out to Mr. Delbert Oakes Jr, CDR, USN, Ret, inquiring about the National Presidential hat. Below is an excerpt of where, how and why it came in to exitance, enjoy. ~Amber

Regarding the National AAO Presidential hat: In my bio you will see that on 1 December 1988, MMMU-1 was re-designated an operational unit of the United States Navy and commissioned Naval Airborne Weapons Maintenance Unit One (NAWMU-1). In a ceremony officiated by Commander Fleet Air Western Pacific, I became the unit's first commanding officer.

I had invited several folks from local commands including representatives from Naval Magazines Subic. One of the employees, a native Negrito member of the Aeta tribe, presented a ceremonial hat to me, saying that I had become the "Big Boss" since I was now a commanding officer. I brought the hat back to the United States mid-1990 when I was relieved by the next Commanding Officer, Commander Terry Timms. At the 1990 AAO reunion, in a morale-boosting effort, I presented the hat to LCDR Chuck Onken the AAO President, explained the history of the hat, and proposed that our AAO President (Big Boss) wear the hat at all future AAO reunions.

Your interest in the hat is appreciated. Who knew it would live on! I Thanks for the photo of Commander Edon wearing the hat. Do you know if his successors continue the tradition? If so, you may repair the hat as necessary. If interest no longer exists, I would be delighted to have the hat returned to me.
